# EVENTS

The ICS conducted **nine** events in October and November 2024.

# OCTOBER

The Institute organised a seminar titled, <u>Manufacturing Ambitions Minus Chinese</u> Investments? <u>Smartphone Companies in India and the 'Indianisation' Fix</u>, on 9 October 2024. The speaker was **Anand P. Krishnan**, Fellow, Centre of Excellence for Himalayan Studies, School of Humanities and Social Sciences, Shiv Nadar Institution of Eminence (SNIoE), Delhi-NCR; and Adjunct Fellow, Institute of Chinese Studies, New Delhi. The speaker facused on the role and challenges of Chinese smartphone companies in India, in the backdrop of the tensions following the 2020 Galwan clash. The session was chaired by **Ravi Bhoothalingam**, Emeritus Fellow, Institute of Chinese Studies, New Delhi; Fellow, Royal Geographical Society, London; and, Founder and Chairman, Manas Advisory, Gurugram. The Chair noted that Chinese companies have adapted well to adverse conditions, showcasing their resilience in the face of local pressures and market challenges. **(YouTube)**  On 16 October 2024, the Institute organised a seminar titled, India and Taiwan's Converging Interests in Southeast Asia: The Case of 'Act East' and 'New Southbound' Policies. The speaker was Karl Chee Leong LEE, Senior Lecturer, Institute of China Studies (ICS), University of Malaya, Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia; Advisor, Taiwan Chamber of Commerce in Malaysia (TWCHAM) and, Expert Advisor, Market Research Future. The speaker reviewed India's Act East Policy (AEP) and Taiwan's New Southbound Policy (NSP) within the framework of Indo-Pacific cooperation and sought to explore convergences regarding the ASEAN. The session was chaired by Aravind Yelery, Associate Professor, Centre for East Asian Studies, Jawaharlal Nehru University; and, Honorary Fellow, Institute of Chinese Studies, New Delhi. The Chair noted the growing influence of Southeast Asian countries in the world, especially Malaysia. He also pointed out how the NSP has a huge scoepe for improvement. (YouTube)

On 23 October 2024, the Institute organised a seminar titled, <u>Gurudev Rabindranath</u> <u>Tagore in Shanghai</u>. The speaker was **Ambassador Riva Ganguly Das**, former Indian Foreign Service officer; and, Distinguished Fellow, Council for Strategic and Defense Research (CSDR), New Delhi. The speaker explored Gurudev Rabindranath Tagore's historic journey to Shanghai in 1924, followed by another sojourn in 1929, both of which marked significant milestones in advancing cultural relations between India and China. The session was chaired by **Sabaree Mitra**, Professor, Centre for Chinese and South East Asian Studies, School of Language, Literature and Culture Studies, Jawaharlal Nehru University; and, Honorary Fellow, Institute of Chinese Studies, New Delhi. The Chair highlighted the fact that when Tagore visited Shanghai in 1929, he travelled from Japan, suggesting a connection with the country. However, in 1937, when Japan invaded China, Tagore strongly condemned the aggression. (YouTube)

On 26 October 2024, the Institute of Chinese Studies (ICS), New Delhi, in colloboration with the India International Centre (IIC), organised a roundtable on the theme, "Will the Current Stimulus Fix China's Economy?". The session featured Dr. Alicia García-Herrero, a leading economist, who unpacked the Chinese government's latest stimulus measures and assessed their potential impact. The discussion focused on China's structural economic challenges—ranging from instability in the real estate sector and demographic shifts, to rising local government debt and the effectiveness of short-term policy responses. It also examined the implications for India, particularly in the context of trade relations and regional economic dynamics. Attended by scholars, policy experts, and industry professionals, the <u>programme</u> offered a timely and critical perspective on China's evolving economic landscape. The discussions have been encapsulated in a comprehensive <u>report</u>.

On 30 October 2024, the Institute organised a seminar titled, LDP's Leadership Test in Japan's Lower House Election: Assessing the Political Pulse. The speaker was Titli Basu, Associate Professor, Centre for East Asian Studies, School of International Studies, Jawaharlal Nehru University, New Delhi. The speaker explored the political fallout in Japan, in the context of the ruling Liberal Democratic Party (LDP)-led coalition losing its majority in the recent Lower House elections. This has impacted the leadership dynamics in Japan, and the speaker argued that it will have serious implications for Japan's efforts towards a Free and Open Indo-Pacific. The session was chaired by **Deepa Wadhwa**, Chairperson, India-Japan Friendship Forum, New Delhi. (YouTube).

#### NOVEMBER

On 6 November 2024, the Institute organised a seminar titled, <u>The Rise of China's Silicon</u> Valley? <u>The Growth of Research and Development in the Guangdong-Hong Kong-Macao</u> <u>Greater Bay Area</u>. The speaker was **Laurie Pearcey**, Advisor to the President and College Master, Chinese University of Hong Kong (Shenzhen). The speaker focussed on the research and development across the Greater Bay Area (GBA) and the competitiveness of Hong Kong's university system in the wider GBA. The session was chaired by **Ravi Bhothalingam**, Emeritus Fellow, Institute of Chinese Studies, New Delhi; Fellow, Royal Geographical Society, London; and, Founder and Chairman, Manas Advisory, Gurugram. The Chair noted that Western restrictions on the research and development of critical technologies in Chinese universities could be a critical issue. (<u>YouTube</u>)

On 13 November 2024, the Institute organised a seminar titled, <u>Evaluating\_the</u> <u>Dichotomies in India's and China's 'Regionalism' in the Indo-Pacific Region</u>. The speaker was **Kulkarni Mandar Vijay**, Faculty of Economics, GITAM School of Humanities and Social Sciences, Hyderabad. The speaker examined the differing approaches that India and China adopt toward regionalism in the Indo-Pacific. The chair was **Rityusha Mani Tiwary**, Assistant Professor, Department of Political Science, Shaheed Bhagat Singh College, University of Delhi; and, Honorary Fellow, Institute of Chinese Studies, New Delhi. The Chair highlighted how the dynamics in the Indo-Pacific region have shifted due to the impact of CoVID-19 and the evolving needs of the region. (<u>Vaurube</u>)

The Institute organised the 17<sup>th</sup> All India Conference of China Studies (AICCS) in collaboration with the China Study Centre, Department of Geopolitics and International Relations, Manipal Academy of Higher Education (Institution of Eminence), Manipal. The conference was held in TMA Pai Hall, Manipal, from 21 to 23 November 2024, with the special theme, <u>Understanding China in a Turbulent World: Geopolitical Contestation</u> and <u>Cooperation</u>. Spread over three days, the conference featured scholars from various institutions in India and abroad and showcased a survey of recent scholarship on various facets of China over thirteen sessions. On 27 November 2024, the Institute organised a seminar titled, <u>China and the Global</u> <u>Nuclear Order: The Long March to Strategic Deterrence</u>. The speaker was **Renu Rana**, Faculty Member, International Studies, Department of Social Sciences, FLAME University, Pune. The speaker explored China's evolving nuclear posture in the context of global transformations in nuclear strategy, disarmament, and deterrence dynamics. The Chair was **M. S. Prathibha**, Associate Fellow, East Asia Centre, MP-IDSA, New Delhi; and, Member, Editorial Board, Strategic Analysis. The Chair noted that China is perceived as a balancer in the international order, given its stance on disarmament and nuclear non-proliferation, and has emerged as one of the strongest defenders of nuclear non-proliferation.
