EVENTS

The ICS conducted eleven events in December 2024 and January 2025.

DECEMBER

The ICS organised a seminar titled, Cross-Strait Relations and Challenges for Taiwan's Indo-Pacific Policy on 4 December 2024. The speaker was Mei-chuan Wei, Associate Professor at the Graduate Institute of Development Studies (GIDS), National Chengchi University (NCCU). The speaker focused on the challenges Taiwan faces in cross-strait relations and its evolving role in the Indo-Pacific. The session was chaired by Aravind Yelery, Associate Professor Jawaharial Nehru University, New Delhi; and, Honorary Fellow, Institute of Chinese Studies. He noted that studying about Taiwanese indigenous perspectives on contemporary politics from the point of view of political theory and historiography, provides more compelling narratives of Taiwan's relationship with mainland China. The ICS organised a panel discussion on the 19th Russia-India-China Trilateral Academic Conference, 2024, on 9 December, 2024. The discussion explored the outcomes of the 19th Russia-India-China Trilateral Academic Conference hosted by The Institute of China and Contemporary Asia of the Russian Academy of Sciences in Moscow from 9-10 October, 2024. The speakers were Anuradha Chenoy, Adjunct Professor, Jindal Global University, Sonipat; Jabin T. Jacob, Associate Professor, Shiv Nadar Institution of Eminence, Delhi NCR; and, Honorary Fellow, Institute of Chinese Studies, New Delhi; Lt. Gen. S.L. Narasimhan, Adjunct Distinguished Fellow, Gateway House, Mumbai; and, Adjunct Professor, NIAS, Bengaluru; and, Aravind Yelery, Associate Professor, Centre for East Asian Studies, School of International Studies, Jawaharlal Nehru University, New Delhi; and, Honorary Fellow, Institute of Chinese Studies, New Delhi. The speakers addressed regional and global challenges, including India's need for investments, China's search for markets amidst Western pressures, and Russia's focus on trilateral cooperation to maintain regional relevance. The speakers also noted that bilateral tensions, limited organisational scope, and contrasting agendas create barriers. While Russia seeks alignment, China's focus on ideological initiatives and pragmatic cooperation often results in scepticism about achieving substantial outcomes. The speakers also highlighted that progress in RIC energy collaboration remains limited, and while Russia benefits from hydrocarbon exports, energy transition efforts are hindered by inadequate investment, innovation, and cooperation, with key benchmarks like accessibility and affordability unmet. The panel discussion was moderated by Alka Acharya, Director ICS; and, Professor and Chairperson, Centre for East Asian Studies, School of International Studies, Jawaharlal Nehru University, New Delhi who characterised the conference as a platform uniting onefifth of humanity and some of the largest territorial spaces, bringing together rising powers with deep historical, cultural, civilisational, economic, and political linkages, making it a bloc to be reckoned with, capable of fostering meaningful exchanges. On 11 December 2024, the ICS organised a seminar titled, The Chinese Community in India: Negotiating Mobility and Belonging. The speaker was Severin Kuok, Guest faculty in Chinese language, School of Global Affairs, Dr B. R. Ambedkar University, Delhi; and a recipient of the ICS-HYI Multi-Year Doctoral Fellowship in China Studies in 2014-15. The speaker highlighted the complex experiences of the Chinese community in India and their multifaceted identities shaped by migration and cultural fusion. The session was chaired by Ritu Agarwal, Associate Professor, Centre for East Asian Studies, School of International Studies, Jawaharlal Nehru University. The Chair observed how the Chinese diaspora is unique due to its size and long migration history, which is reflected not only in the presence of Chinatowns, but also in the ways in which these communities navigate identity, belonging, and space within different societies. The 7th India Forum on China (IFC) was held at the MIT School of Government, MIT World Peace University, Pune, from December 13 to 15, 2024. Organised by the ICS in collaboration with the Centre of Excellence for Himalayan Studies, Shiv Nadar Institution of Eminence, Delhi-NCR, and the MIT School of Government, the forum brought together a diverse group of scholars and practitioners from India and across the world. The theme of the conference was "The Intersection of Science and Technology in China's Industrial Revolution and Challenges to India and the World'. The forum facilitated in-depth discussions on China's advancements in science and technology, their implications for global industrial development, and the challenges they pose for India and the international community. The Keynote Address was delivered by Lieutenant General Ajay Kumar Singh, PVSM, AVSM, SM, VSM, former Lieutenant Governor, Andaman and Nicobar Islands; former General Officer Commanding-in-Chief, Southern Command of Indian Army, (YouTube)

On 18 December 2024, the ICS organised a seminar titled, The Future of Cross-Static Relations under a Second Trump Presidency: Taiwan's Imperatives and Options. The speaker was Ping-Kuei Chen, Professor, Department of Diplomacy, National Chengchi University, Taiwan. The speaker explored the evolving dynamics of Cross-strait relations and the Taiwan-US-China triangle, particularly in the light of recent elections in Taiwan and the US. The session was chaired by Raviprasad Narayanan, Associate Professor, Centre for East Asian Studies, Jawaharlal Nehru University; Adjunct Fellow, ICS, who argued that Taiwan should be considered a country, as it is a member of the World Trade Organisation (WTO). JANUARY

On 6 January 2025, the ICS, New Delhi hosted **Kawashima Shin**, Professor, Graduate School of Arts and Sciences, University of Tokyo, Japan, and **Shimomura Munetaka**, Second Secretary, Embassy of Japan in India. The event was chaired by **Alka Acharya**, Director ICS, and attended by senior Fellows of the ICS and faculty from Jawaharial Nehru University, University of Delhi, and Jindal Global University. Kawashima, who specialises in the international history of East Asia and Japan-China relations, examined in depth the foreign policy objectives and global perception of China, identifying key issues and trends. Linking present-day developments with historical precedents, Kawashima explored various sub-themes, including China's domestic politics, which exercises a significant impact on its foreign policy-making, and also examined the implications of China's actions for Taiwan.

On 8 January 2025, the ICS organised a seminar titled, Between Positive and Negative Interdependence: India's Dynamic Amidst the US-China Rivalry. The speaker was Vivek Y. Kelkar, Adjunct Faculty, Indian Institute of Information Technology and Management; and, Visiting Faculty, Indian Institute of Management Indore. The speaker explored the complex economic and geopolitical dynamics shaped by the rivalry between the US and China, with a particular emphasis on India's strategies for navigating this emerging and dynamic landscape. The session was chaired by G. Venkat Raman, Professor, Indian Institute of Management Indore and Honorary Fellow, ICS. He emphasised the impact of tech wars and nationalism on trade, leading to supply chain disruptions and a split global system between the US and China. (YouTube)

The ICS hosted **Arunabh Ghosh**, Associate Professor, Department of History, Harvard University, on 10 January 2025, for an interaction with senior Fellows and young researchers. The discussion covered various themes, including contemporary issues in China. Ghosh provided valuable insights into different methods of data collection. He also offered useful suggestions regarding archival research, especially in various cities in different provinces in China.

On 15 January 2025, the ICS organised a seminar titled, China's Expanding Role in UN Peace Operations: Domestic Debates and 'Developmental Peace'. The speaker was Md Yasin, Assistant Professor, Aligarh Muslim University; Recipient of the Harvard Yenching Institute – Institute of Chinese Studies Multi-Year Doctoral Fellowship in China Studies (2018-2022). The speaker focused on China's evolving role in UN peacekeeping, highlighting its contributions and the factors shaping its approach, including political, economic, military, and cultural motivations. The session was chaired by Alka Acharya, Director ICS; and, Professor and Chairperson, Centre for East Asian Studies, School of International Studies, Jawaharlal Nehru University, New Delhi. The chair highlighted frameworks that look at peace in many different ways and not merely as the absence of conflict. She highlighted the speaker's research on the Chinese idea of 'developmental peace', which needs to be explored in greater depth. (YouTube)

The ICS organised a special panel discussion titled, Celebrating 10 Years of ICS-HYI Multi-Year Doctoral Fellowship in China Studies on 22 January 2025. The speakers were Veda Vaidvanathan, Associate Fellow, Centre for Social and Economic Progress (CSEP), New Delhi and four doctoral scholars, who are the current recipients of the ICS-HYI Fellowship. Pawan Amin, (Centre for East Asian Studies, Jawaharlal Nehru University), Shubhda Gurung, (Centre for Chinese and South East Asian Studies, Jawaharlal Nehru University), Nishant Sharma, (O.P. Jindal Global University), and Cherry Hitkari, (Department of East Asian Studies, University of Delhi). The moderator, Ravi Bhoothalingam, Emeritus Fellow, ICS and Fellow, Royal Geographical Society, London, outlined the framework for the panel discussion and specified the salient themes and issues to be discussed. Alka Acharya, Director, Institute of Chinese Studies; and, Professor and Chairperson, Centre for East Asian Studies, School of International Studies, Jawaharlal Nehru University, New Delhi, provided opening remarks highlighting the significance of the ICS-HYI partnership. Madhavi Thampi, Honorary Fellow, Institute of Chinese Studies, New Delhi; former Associate Professor, Department of East Asian Studies, Delhi University, concluded the session emphasising the role of the Fellowship in training the next generation of China scholars in India, who shall, through rigorous research and initiatives, highlight the importance of Ching Studies as a field. On 29 January 2025, the ICS organised a seminar titled, The Political Crisis in South Korea: Context and Contours. The speaker was Sandip Kumar Mishra, Professor in Korean Studies, Centre for East Asian Studies, School of International Studies, Jawaharlal Nehru University, New Delhi; and, Honorary Fellow, ICS. The speaker focused on the political turmoil in South Korea following President Yoon's declaration of martial law on 3 December 2024, and his subsequent impeachment. The session was chaired by Alka Acharya, Director, Institute of Chinese Studies, New Delhi; and, Professor and Chairperson, Centre for East Asian Studies, School of International Studies, Jawaharlal Nehru University, New Delhi. Acharya highlighted the fragility of South Korea's democratic institutions, raising concerns about the resilience of political structures and the internalisation of democratic principles. (YouTube)
